THE BEGINNING-

Go karting began in 1956 when Art Ingels built the first go kart that still is recognizable in the modern go karts of today. Although there have been many improvements over the years, **vintage karting still brings the same fun and excitement it did over 60 years ago!**

The **Vintage Karting Association (VKA)** was started in 2001 to promote vintage karting across the country. Today, over a dozen events are held from Maryland to California and New York to Florida every year. Vintage karters enjoy the camaraderie and fun of the two or three-day, **Tier I** or **Tier II** events.

Tier I demonstration events are scored and held for karts that qualify for over ten classes; ranging from Historic Karts to Dual and Triple Engine Karts on rear, sidewinder and enduro frames. Karters who prefer not to be scored and want to start at the back of the grid are also welcome at **Tier I** events. **Tier II** events are not scored and offer plenty of track time for similar vintage karts.

Clintons, Homelites, McCullochs, Power Products, West Bends and even some early foreign engines push these karts around the track ... **just like they used to!** Karts like Bug, Dart, Fox, GoKart, Margay, Putt-Nick, Simplex, *etc.* are just examples of many of the sprint and enduro karts from the early years at these events. Static displays and judging of these karts are part of Kart Shows, too.

WHAT VKA DOES-

VKA is a non-sanctioning, non-profit organization whose mission is to promote exhibition of these, now historic, sprint and enduro machines in both static Kart Shows that highlight the restoration talents of vintage karters and Demonstration Events that allow vintage karters the opportunity to operate these functional, historic machines on the track, recreating the look and excitement of actual competition. VKA establishes *Guidelines* that allow Event Promoters to hold events for vintage karts that are **consistent** with other events across the country.



FOR MORE INFORMATION-

VKA FIRSTTURN[®], a periodic publication, provides a wealth of information. The VKA web-site (www.VKAkarting.com) is another valuable resource. The **VKA Forum** is a place for members and non-members alike to ask questions and share information about vintage karting projects and problems. Members and non-members can buy and sell karts and parts and post notices of hard to get items. The VKA web-site also provides up-to-date information on all the VKA Events; Dates; Locations; Contact info; Event flyers; *Guidelines* and more. 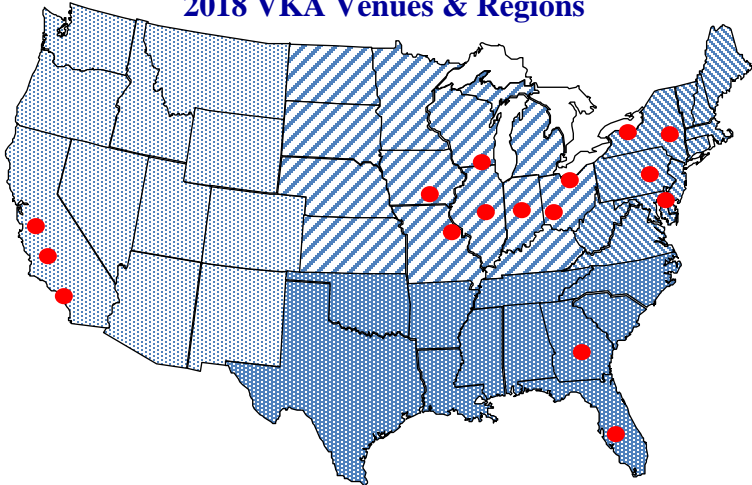
